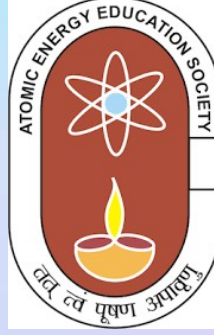

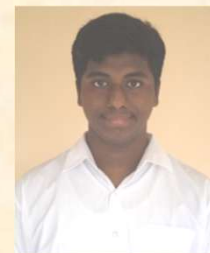

Vigilance Awareness Week

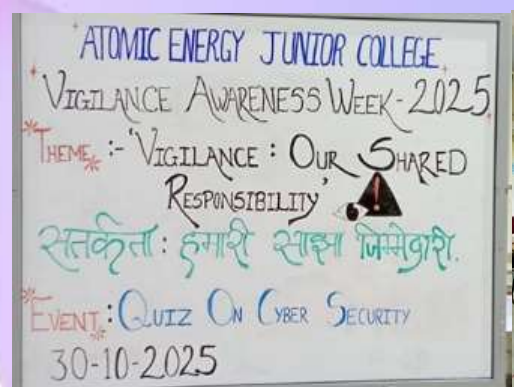

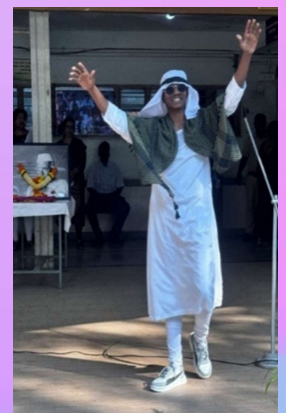
A Talk on 'Science through Ages'

A SESSION ON 'RABIES AWARENESS-CUM-DOG MENACE AND ITS PREVENTIVE MEASURES'

In recent years, the problem of stray and aggressive dogs has increased in many urban and rural areas. The growing dog menace has become a serious public safety and health concern, affecting children, elderly people and commuters. Dog bites and the spread of the diseases such as rabies are some of the major issues associated with this problem.

To make the students aware about the dog bites and the transmission of rabies and its preventive measures, Shri. Aman Tiwari and Shri. Mrutunjay Dubey, the two eminent members of UK based NGO Worldwide Veterinary Service, conducted a session in collaboration with BMC on 'Rabies Awareness-cum-Dog Menace and its Preventive measures' on 6th February 2026 at 8:30 am at Homi Bhabha Hall.

The lively session with help of PPT presentation began with the clarification of the term rabies and how it transmits from animal to animal and animal to humans. Thereafter, they focused on the dog behaviour, identification of rabies affected dogs and ways to get rid of dog assaults. They also made us aware about the treatments if a dog bite occurred such as washing the wounds with soap for 15 minutes in running water and taking anti-rabies vaccines. They also urged immediate and appropriate action after a dog bite can prevent serious complications including rabies and save lives.

A one and a half hour session was quite interactive, fruitful and educative as the queries and doubts raised by students and teachers were answered. The students became thoroughly aware about the dog behaviour, preventive measures against a dog bite and to save themselves and others from the deadly rabies.



'PARIKSHA PE CHARCHA'

All staff and students of AEJC along with Vice Principal, Shri M Vijay Kumar, attended Pariksha Pe Charcha programme Part-1 and Part-2 which were telecast on 6th February and 9th February 2026 respectively at 10:00am onwards at Homi Bhabha hall.

In the 9th edition of the 'Pariksha Pe Charcha' (PPC), Part-1, Shri Narendra Modi, Prime Minister of India, interacted with students throughout the country ahead of the examination season and helped them manage exam related stress and stay motivated. During the telecast, he offered practical advice and encouragement to students preparing for board exams. The program mainly focused on reducing exam stress and cultivating a positive mindset, time management strategies, balanced study routines, motivating students to dream big and build strong fundamentals rather than focusing only on marks, advising parents to ease academic pressure on their children, stressing the importance of overall well-being, regular sleep, and systematic revision habits, etc.
